

Deacon's Corner

National Vocation Awareness Week is November 4-10, 2018

As Catholics, we firmly believe that God has a plan for our lives! He calls some to marriage, some to the priesthood, and others to religious life. Some remain as generous single people. Fulling living our own vocations—and teaching young people how to discern God's call—is a serious duty, but also a joyful one.

The Main Catholic Vocations

A vocation is a call from God to pursue holiness in a specific way, involving a public and permanent commitment.

Marriage: Most people are called to marriage—a vowed union of a man and woman who promise to love their spousses and to joyfully welcome children.

Priesthood: Priests bring Jesus to people and people to Jesus through preaching and the sacraments. They are ordained to devote their lives to serve the people of God.

Consecrated Life: Both men and women make vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience when they join orders such as the Franciscans, Benedictines, Dominicans. etc.

There are also a number of orders who accept

lay vocations, e.g., The Dominican Order of Preachers. The Lay Dominicans are men and women, singles and couples who are fully incorporated members of the Order of Preachers and live out their Dominican vocation in the secular world.


